I oppose the Liberty Gap Turbine project on Jack Mountain in Pendleton County.

As a member of the Potomac Valley Garden Club I subscribe to the following Conservation Pledge:

I pledge to protect and conserve the natural Resources of the planet Earth and promise to promote education so we may become caretakers of our air, water, forests, land and wildlife.

Article II of our bylaws states:

The object of the club shall be to foster the making of gardens, to stimulate the culture and study of flowers, to beautify yards, to encourage civic planting and aid, where possible in the protection of native trees, shrubs, wildflowers and birds.

I believe the Wind Turbines and accompanying transmission line proposed for Pendleton County will be destructive to the Thorn Creek, the water sources on and close to Jack Mountain, wildlife habitat through out the project, song birds, raptors and bats and rare and endangered plants and shrubs. I further believe that the amount of electricity generated by wind turbines on Jack Mountain does not justify the losses to Pendleton County. Please do not permit this project.
