I live on Jack Mountain and although I understand there is a need for clean energy, I am not convinced that these windmills are efficient.


We were approached to allow the transmission lines to cross our property, but declined to do so although we would have received a considerable amount of money.

I do think the company representatives from outside our state and county will benefit from tax incentives.

I have observed the windmills in Tucker County and find them very unattractive. I feel the beauty of Jack Mountain will be compromised should windmills be constructed.

I hope the PSC will examine this projects impact on the environmental issues and the land desecration very carefully before making a decision.
